

## ***June 6, 2011-Work Session and Public Hearing***

**Public Hearing regarding the proposed improvement of the Town's consolidated light district. Said improvement consists of the installation of a street light at/near 25 Jameson Road. The estimated cost to the consolidated light district for the installation and annual operation, upkeep and maintenance of said light is approximately \$200.00 per year.**

Approval was based on safety issues with several instances of breaking into garages and car theft. The cost goes into Electricity and Lighting.

### **SUPERVISOR REPORT - None**

Supervisor Michael Marinaccio deferred to Oliver Blaise as there was nothing to report at this time.

**ATTORNEY**

Attorney Oliver Blaise reported there was a request to purchase 50 North Broad Street. The titled owners were deceased and the surviving daughters were not currently interested. The county would have to foreclose; this would probably take a few years. It should be noted since the April 4<sup>th</sup> meeting, 50 North Broad Street has since been demolished.

Supervisor Marinaccio introduced Ed Personius, Key Account Manager from NYSEG (New York State Electric and Gas) to present its Commercial Rebate program. The funding is covered by everyone's bill under the Systems Benefits Charge on your bill. The funding is available until 12/31/2011 or until the funding is exhausted. He stated his purpose tonight was primarily to make us aware these various programs exist. The board discussed reviewing our generator needs. The program was well received and the board would be in touch with him as we determine our direction on this matter.

Supervisor Marinaccio was contacted by the Prospect Terrace Fire House that it is in need of a new roof. Attorney Blaise will need to handle if need be.

Joel will be given a name to remove any outdated electronic equipment. In the meantime he is removing all hard drives from the towers.

**HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

Highway Superintendent Joel Kie advised us the **Timco Sweeper** needs repair to the tune of \$11 to 12K as the vacuum feature is not efficient. Ours is 14 years old. The mistake we made is the box is metal; stainless steel would be ideal. During the lengthy discussion these were the main points discussed:


1. \$170K to purchase new.
2. \$145K Used
3. \$75K Stainless steel replacement
4. \$15K Trade in value
5. Rental not worthwhile

Supervisor Marinaccio requested Joel Kie to officially define prior to the 6-13-2011 meeting:

1. Trade in value
2. Request a quote for new
3. Request a quote for used
4. Cost and option of stainless steel replacement
